

# Tortoise Select Opportunity Fund (TOPTX/TOPIX/TOPCX)



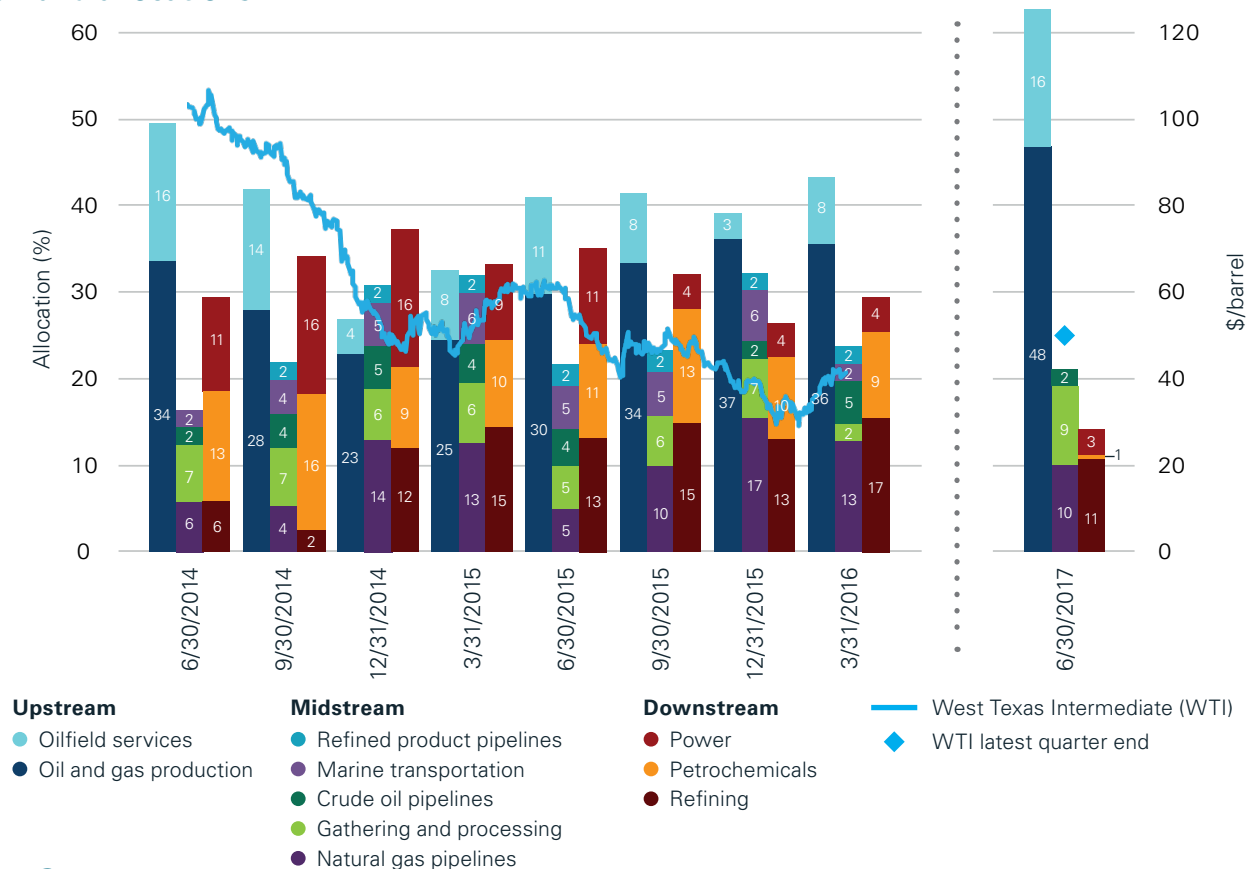
Tortoise Select Opportunity Fund (TOPTX/TOPIX/TOPCX) received a Four-Star Overall Morningstar Rating™ among 97 Equity Energy Funds based on risk-adjusted performance as of 6/30/2017.

The fund's flexible mandate allows it to invest across the entire energy value chain, positioning the portfolio to take advantage of anticipated trends and away from themes that we believe are less opportunistic.

## Theme: crude oil prices peak to trough (7/23/2014 - 2/11/2016)

- As crude oil prices declined, focus shifted toward the downstream segment because refiners and petrochemical companies tend to benefit from a lower price environment.
- When prices remained lower for longer, the fund exploited the need for offshore storage facilities in the marine transportation segment.
- Within the midstream segment, the fund had been more concentrated in natural gas pipelines (which are not directly correlated to crude oil prices) as the need for infrastructure buildout from the natural gas-rich Marcellus basin continued.
- As prices recovered, the fund's allocation to upstream producers increased as rigs came back online.

## Why now?

There are several themes that we believe will offer opportunities across the energy value chain:

1. **Improving prices** – We are encouraged by OPEC's commitment to support prices, and feel that there are themes across the energy value chain that will flourish in a more stable price environment.
2. **Regulatory easing** – With the new U.S. administration, we expect a more favorable regulatory environment, particularly for pipeline infrastructure projects.
3. **Exports** – 2016 was a milestone year for energy exports, including crude oil, liquefied natural gas and ethane. We believe that the U.S. will continue to become a significantly more relevant player in the global energy landscape as it becomes a sustainable, long-term supplier of low-cost energy to the rest of the world.

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating," is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history without adjustment for sales load. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive five stars, the next 22.5% receive four stars, the next 35% receive three stars, the next 22.5% receive two stars, and the bottom 10% receive one star. The Overall Morningstar Rating™ for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating™ metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36 - 59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60 - 119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. As of 6/30/2017, TOPTX/TOPIX/TOPCX were rated against 97 Equity Energy funds over the three-year period. TOPTX/TOPIX/TOPCX each received four stars for that period.
